28.4.87 OKEFORD = DORSET SNR CUP FINAL = THE. 6.30K.O.

Just prior to the kick off we suffered the bad news that Martin Pharaoh had suffered tendons in his right hand and couldn't play. We still had a formidable line up:-

A strong wind blowing directly down the pitch tended to suit the long ball game of Okeford but it was Kyres who almost drew first blood 4 mins after the start when Miller won a high ball challenge sending Foster away on the right. A short pass to Kyres gave the midfielder room to flight a perfect ball for Martin to head down into the corner of the net. A linesman's flag for offside upset the jubilation. The game was end to end with both defences playing well. Jerry Pharaoh, as usual, was full of attacking ideas and his one-pace runs timed to perfection. A couple of desperate clearances half way through the half kept us from opening the scoring. Edge, Hunt & Foster tested the keeper with good shots.

before Okeford hit back with a vengeance bringing the best out of Cistley song. A tremendous double save from a free kick was followed four minutes later with a flying catch from a half volley. Six minutes later and a quick break on the right saw Foster cynically tackled. The free kick was hammered low by Byres into the box and Arnold seized an opportunity from slack marking to pivot quickly and side foot Verwood into the lead.

Girvan came out buzzing in the second half and had the ball in the net in the first minute only for the 'goal' to be disallowed - adjudged offside. The effort came after a Girvan high ball and a Martin back header on the half way line. A harsh decision. We were well on top and with Arnold and Byres prompting in the middle it was inevitable that we would go further ahead. Edge taking a throw in on the left found Girvan, a clever overhead flick found Foster and a rasping left foot drive hit the net. Seven minutes from time Martin went close from 30 yards but was rewarded for his tireless effort in the last minute when he rose majestically to power a header into the roof of the net from an Byres corner.

The celebration buffet and bar at Wimborne Town's Club House was superb and a big vote of thanks goes to Paul Martin's parents for putting on a fine spread.

Only a shadow of last night's team faced Banksome. Owing long working late - Martin Pharaoh in plaster - Adrian Arnold on maternity leave. Martin Shuttles damaged ankle and fracture foster pulled hamstring had to play. Tony Pharaoh went in goal and before his team had chance to settle two quick goals in the first ten minutes set Banksome for a victory. Pharaoh pulled off two good successive saves in the 20th minute but the team was fighting back with Guy on the right going close with a strong right foot drive. A lucky shot through a pack of players regrettably crept past an unsighted Pharaoh for number three. 5 mins later a high ball deceived Givens and Banksome went four up. Martin was giving a good account of himself up front but the team looked shaky at the whistle. Manager Rod Lock made two positional switches at half time. 4.5.87 PARLEY LG (A)

Stuart stayed in at full back for an injured Tony Bharwani who soon in action coolly using Long with a good back pass. Foster was looking good in a new midfield role and after 12 mins a neat exchange with Edge let the latter through a packed defence and a 25 yard right foot crackerjack put Verwood ahead. Parley got their act together and pushed forward testing our centre combination of Miller and Givens. With Long in such fine form, it was inevitable that the half should close with Verwood ahead, 5 mins into the second half though a break on the right and a ball pulled back from the bye line had us at sixes and sevens. A low shot hit the net - 1-1. Martin sorted out the difficulties in the 21st min. when he received a ball just outside the box, skirted his way round the full back and coolly placed a right foot shot wide of an advancing keeper. Rod took on for an injured Foster surprised everyone when he broke into a walk in the 30th minute and slipped a through ball to Gale who went close following a fine run. Rod climbed back on his stretcher for the last 15 mins and it looked as though we had a pair of book-ends in the middle with Shakespeare wearing an oxygen mask after a sterling effort which he jumped 12 inches to head a cross ball. Electric came back hard but Edge Miller and Grieve were simply superb whilst on the right flank Stuart Guy looked extremely competent holding his wingman in check and slipping excellent balls to the front runners. Gibbs was at home in the middle - strong tackling, good passing - it was as though he had never missed a game. The match was into its 20th minute before the next goal and it was Captain Grieve knocking in a u-bound that settled the game 3-0.

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

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


