RAIN STOPS PLAY

Billy Andrews soars away at the top of our goalscorer charts as he slams home 20 goals at the end of February 88.

12.12.87 CHRISTCHURCH LG (H)

The game opened briskly with Christchurch using their left flank. Tony Pharoah won the ball and Giverny collected a crossfield pass to spark off Arnold on the right. A good run and cross almost let in Martin but a good save prevented an early goal. Shuster was having a hectic wing with a speedy right flank man making exciting game for the spectators. It was Mike Eyes who opened the scoring though in the 13th minute with a terrific scoop shot looping the keeper into the top R-H corner of the net. A sparkling Martin Pharoah almost made it 2-0 a minute later but his shot clapped the post. A counter attack in the 27th minute caught us napping and a curled shot beat Long. Chern set the game alight in the second half and was rewarded for his efforts in the 56th minute when he sparked off Arnold whose shot was beaten out for Chern to slot the ball into the net as he followed up. 17min later Christchurch were level as a corner kick headed out for an inrushing forward to score on the volley. It was Eyes that served the day though as he soared to an Eyes corner heading a fine goal into the bottom corner of the net. The game finished with Venzel well on top and Arnold hitting the bar as the whistle blew.

19.12.87 BOURNEMOUTH POPPIES (H) CUP.

Both teams were at full stretch for this tie with Poppy the clear favourites. Certainly they looked better in the early exchanges and extremely dangerous on the break. Tony Pharoah and Martin Shuster were under intense pressure with two lively opposing wingers and it was a break on the right in the 31st minute that opened us up for a cross to be side footed in from 2 yds. 9 mins later we went hot down as a scoop over a defensive wall was hit on the volley poor helpless Long.

Edge and Gineria kept us in the game in the closing minutes of the half with some terrific defensive play. Martin Pharaoh opened up the second half with a fine run and shot and Foster was coming more into the game as we pushed forward. Shumland and Tony Pharaoh looked stronger and more confident and Cycles began using his skills to split the ball to the front runners. Martin was causing Poppies headaches and his pass to Foster drew the defenders allowing Foster to send away Arnold who chip past the keeper for a superb goal. The 67th minute saw Martin score a RF thunderbolt after an Cycles free kick had been headed down by Tony Pharaoh. We had Poppies on the attack and Foster and Cycles almost clinched the game but two super saves took us into extra time. We were on a high and carried the game to the Poppies. Dan Gau on for them smashed us into the lead in the 98th minute following a dazzling Foster run and lay back from the line. Johnson and Tony Pharaoh stormed away from the half way line, drew the keeper and cheekily chipped Newwood into the next round.

minute to let in Foster to put VFC ahead. Rydes forced their way back into the game but Lyneham and Stubbs were solid and unmovable. An on form Ashley sang easily with the odd shot. The Pharoahs were in superb form and with Shattock overlapping on the left, Rydes had their work cut out trying to contain the attacks. In the 45th minute though a pinpoint Eyes cross found a diving Foster and we went two up as the ball hit the reef of the net. Although no goals were scored in the second half the football was superb with them stamping his class in the middle and Martin always threatening up front.

### 21.88 BURTON (A) CUP.

This fixture should have been played at Burton but a flooded pitch meant Potters housing the game. It was a pity we didn't play at Burton, it would have saved home supporters a lot of embarrassment. We had 90% of the play and tried to dazzle third division Burton with personal displays. There was no real team effort and the shots at goal were a joke. Had Arnold's "goal" not been disallowed for him calling "let it run" it might have been a different story but the end result was a 2-0 defeat that saw us exit the Pickford Cup Competition this season.

23/1/83 CHRISTCHURCH (A) CUP

Hurn was flooded following heavy storms so the fixture was re-arranged for Potters. Christchurch took on the lighter at the start and our misfortune was almost swift in as they touched the ball power the first. It was a good save in the first minute and gave us a taste of things to come. It was 20 mins before we settled and gradually began to show the capabilities that took us through to these late stages of the Cup. Despite being beaten it was a thoroughly enjoyable game and we knew we were unlucky to lose.

26/1/83 BINSTED (A) CUP

Last week's abortive trip to the Kow was modified as the pitch was declared fit despite the heavy rain. It was like playing on a farm track with very little width to cause us play our usual sweeping attacking style of football. We literally ranged in our opponents half for 90 mins as we tried to beat a massed defence and a bumpy area. Our lassitude in defence as we pushed up in the 10th minute allowed Binsted's w's to run free and score but the impossible Foster levelled the scores in the 11th minute with a brilliantly controlled

goal just inside the by-line. The game went into extra time and in the 104th minute a powerful header from a corner put Birstead 2-1 ahead. We tried to rally to the winds and pushed forward but the day was epitomised as Willie Chern broke away in the 108th minute of the game and his usual deadly killer instinct deserted him as his shot clipped the bar and went over. There was a distinct feeling that had the game been played on Pottersne we would have gone through to the semi final.

30.1.83 QUEENS PARK (H) LG

Terry Pharoah stole the day. Strong running, good interchange and a cracking third goal made it a match to remember. We opened well and it was obvious that Q.P. posed no threat. Edge and Tubbs were formidable in defence allowing Shuter to use the overlap with ease. Martin was causing havoc but it was skipper Ginevra who opened up the scoring heading a fine goal from a pin-point Eyres cross. Gale went close in the 2nd minute when his header was cleared off the line and then Foster was unlucky with a shot that cannoned back from the inside of the post. Tubbs opened up the second half in attacking style breaking through and hitting the post and then Foster tantalised and tortured the Q.P.

defence with dazzling footwork and his clever passing with Arnold was creating plenty of openings. It was Arnold however who snatched goal No 2 with a break from the half way line then cracking in a 20-yard rasper. 
